WELCOME TO LINO LAKES

Lino Lakes, Minnesota, is a vibrant suburban city located just 20 miles north of the Twin Cities. With a population of approximately 22,000, Lino Lakes combines small-town charm with big-city convenience, making it an attractive destination for residents and visitors alike. Its location near Interstate 35 provides quick and easy access to Minneapolis and St. Paul, while maintaining a peaceful and family-friendly atmosphere.

One of Lino Lakes' standout features is its natural beauty. The City is home to the Rice Creek Chain of Lakes Regional Park Reserve, a 5,500-acre expanse offering endless outdoor recreation opportunities. From hiking, biking, and canoeing in the warmer months to cross-country skiing, snowshoeing, and ice fishing in the winter, there's always something for nature enthusiasts to enjoy. Additionally, Lino Lakes boasts an extensive network of local parks, playgrounds, and trails, making it ideal for families and active individuals.

The City is home to a diverse mix of businesses, from local shops and restaurants to large employers, creating a dynamic economic landscape. Recent development projects have brought modern commercial spaces and infrastructure enhancements, further positioning the City as a prime location for investment. The City's focus on sustainability and smart growth ensures that economic progress aligns with environmental stewardship and community well-being.

The sense of community in Lino Lakes is another key draw. Annual events such as Blue Heron Days and the VFW's Corn Roast create opportunities for neighbors to connect and celebrate. The City places a high priority on safety and well-being, supported by an active Public Safety department and engaged residents who contribute to the community's friendly and welcoming environment.

For families, Lino Lakes offers excellent schools in the Centennial, Forest Lake, and White Bear Lake districts, known for their strong academic programs and extracurricular opportunities. The City also caters to a range of housing preferences, from modern developments to established neighborhoods, ensuring options for everyone.

Whether you're looking for outdoor adventures, a close-knit community, or proximity to urban amenities, Lino Lakes provides a perfect balance of lifestyle, opportunity, and natural beauty. It's a city where you can truly live, work, and play.



The City operates under a Mayor-Council system, with an elected Mayor and four City Council members who make decisions on policies, budgets, and long-term planning. The City Council meets regularly to review city operations and approve new projects.

Several advisory boards and committees play a key role in shaping city policies. These include the Planning and Zoning Board, Park Board, Environmental Board, and Economic Development Advisory Committee where local residents volunteer their time and expertise to influence decisions on land use, parks, and economic development.

City Hall is the heart of city operations, where departments such as Community Development, Finance, Administration, Communications, and Human Resources manage daily services. Public Safety oversees Police and Fire services, and Public Services oversees Public Works, Parks and The Rookery Activity Center.

Lino Lakes works closely with Anoka County on regional planning and public health initiatives, and it partners with state and federal agencies to address concerns like infrastructure funding and environmental regulations. The City is poised for continued growth and development, thanks to its proactive approach to leadership and long-term planning.

A key focus for the City Council is evaluating the current public safety model, which combines Police and Fire services. A study is underway to assess whether separating these functions would be more effective for the community. The study is expected to be completed by spring of 2025. The City currently operates two fire stations, ensuring comprehensive emergency services.

In addition to public safety improvements, Lino Lakes is investing in infrastructure. A \$16 million Public Works Facility will be under construction, with completion slated for 2027. A new water treatment plant to serve the growing population is currently under construction.

Lino Lakes is supported by a strong management team, with department heads working collaboratively to develop effective strategies for success. The Interim Administrator is providing excellent leadership, with plans to involve the incoming City Administrator in hiring a new Finance Director to further strengthen the team. To retain and support its staff, the City Council has approved a 6% pay increase for City employees in both 2025 and 2026, for a total of 12% over two years.



Lino Lakes offers a wide range of recreational opportunities for residents and visitors, thanks to its abundance of parks, lakes, and trails. The City is home to over 800 acres of parks and green spaces, providing numerous options for outdoor activities. One of the highlights is the Rice Creek Chain of Lakes Regional Park Reserve, a 5,500-acre park that offers over 16 miles of trails for hiking, biking, and cross-country skiing, as well as canoeing, fishing, and birdwatching opportunities. The City's 20+ parks provide picnic areas, sports fields, ice rinks, pickleball courts, and playgrounds, ideal for family outings and casual recreation.

Lino Lakes is also a great location for water activities, with a chain of lakes including Peltier Lake, Marshan Lake, Rice Lake (hosts a float plane facility), George Watch Lake, Reshanau Lake, portions of Baldwin Lake, Centerville Lake, Otter Lake, and Bald Eagle Lake, offering opportunities for boating, fishing, swimming, and kayaking. In the winter, these lakes become perfect spots for ice fishing, while the City's parks transform into spaces for snowshoeing and cross-country skiing.

The City is well-connected by an extensive trail system, including the Rice Creek Regional Trail, which links parks and provides scenic routes for cycling, walking, and running. The trails are a popular destination year-round for outdoor enthusiasts. For sports lovers, Lino Lakes has indoor and outdoor courts for pickleball players, as well as golf courses like Chomonix Golf Course for those who enjoy golfing.


The Rookery Activity Center serves as a hub for various programs and services. The center boasts amenities such as a fitness floor, gymnasium, and indoor aquatic center featuring both a zero-depth warm water splash pool and a six-lane lap pool.

PUBLIC SCHOOLS

Lino Lakes is primarily served by three school districts:

Centennial School District (ISD 12) - The Centennial School District serves approximately 6,400 students. The district operates five elementary schools, one middle schools, and one high school, providing comprehensive education and extracurricular programs. Known for academic excellence and community engagement, it fosters a supportive and inclusive learning environment.

Forest Lake Area School District (ISD 831) - The Forest Lake Area School District serves over 7,000 students across 13 schools, including elementary, middle, and high schools. Spanning a large geographic area, the district emphasizes academic achievement, innovative programs, and strong community partnerships to support student success in a safe and inclusive environment.

White Bear Lake School District (ISD 624) - The White Bear Lake Area School District serves over 8,000 students across nine communities. It operates several elementary, middle, and high schools, offering diverse academic programs, arts, and athletics. The district is committed to educational excellence, equity, and fostering a supportive community for lifelong learning.

HEALTHCARE

Lino Lakes, Minnesota, provides residents with access to high-quality healthcare services, combining local facilities with proximity to major medical centers in the Twin Cities metropolitan area. The City prioritizes the health and well-being of its residents through a range of providers and programs. Lino Lakes also benefits from a variety of local clinics, including dental, chiropractic, and physical therapy services, making healthcare convenient and accessible for families. Additionally, the City promotes wellness through its parks, recreation programs, and outdoor activities, which support residents' overall health and well-being.

CHAIN OF LAKES

Rice Creek Chain of Lakes Park Reserve is a 5500-acre park in the northeast metro. It is one of the largest parks in the metro area stretching from Lexington and Circle Pines up through Lino Lakes and down to Centerville. Family-friendly amenities include the Wargo Nature Center, a playground, a beach on Centerville Lake and space for picnics. Visitors can camp, bike, boat, canoe, golf, cross-country ski, fish, geocache, and hike. The park boasts "some of the most significant native wildlife habitat and water resources in the regional area". The Rice Creek North Regional Trail meanders through this park.

THE ROOKERY ACTIVITY CENTER

The City of Lino Lakes opened the Rookery Activity Center in 2022. The Rookery building started as a YMCA location that closed its doors in 2020 during the COVID-19 pandemic. The Lino Lakes City Council and staff members decided to re-open the building as a City-run activity center that services residents and the local community. The Rookery houses a 2-pool aquatic center, a gymnasium, fitness floor with fitness machines and a fitness studio, as well as two community use rooms.

The Rookery hosts several seasonal family events throughout the year, offerings swimming lessons, pickleball courses, senior citizen activities and more.

City of Lino Lakes staff members receive a free single membership to the Rookery as a benefit of employment with the City.

AREA BUSINESSES

Lino Lakes and surrounding cities are home to many corporate and local retail businesses that provide services to residents, as well as employment opportunities.

Additionally, Lino Lakes has a variety of sit-down and fast food restaurant options - many of which are locally owned and operated.
